How about examples from last year?

- ▶ **14,000.** Free prescription medicines were provided to uninsured patients by the Helping Hand Clinic.

- ▶ **\$50.** Secures 278 pounds of food for distribution to local families by the Christians United Outreach Center.
- ▶ **28.** Fire, flood and other disaster survivors received relief from the local American Red Cross chapter.
- ▶ **2,942.** Local residents received some kind of practical assistance from the Coalition for Families of Lee County.
- ▶ **\$50.** Provides transportation for two cancer patients to receive treatment, thanks to Highway for Healing.
- ▶ **\$10.** Provides one month of instructional materials to help a preschooler at Warren Williams be ready for kindergarten.
- ▶ **24.** Local nonprofits receive your United Way contributions after being carefully evaluated by local volunteers.
- ▶ **1,000.** Youth participated in values-based educational programs by the Boys and Girls Clubs of Sanford/Lee County.
- ▶ **51.** Years the United Way of Lee County has been serving neighbors when they need help the most.
